The representatives at the Partnership Board come from lots of different groups and organisations.

They all know different things about services for people with learning disabilities and their families in Leicestershire.

By working well together, in the Partnership Board and in their groups and organisations, Partnership Board representatives can help to make sure Valuing People works well in Leicestershire.

We have written this role description to help everyone understand what they need to do to be a good Partnership Board representative.

A role description is a list of the things a good representative will do and the things they need to know.

It helps everyone to do a good job.

It helps make sure the Partnership Board works as well as possible.

What we need you to do

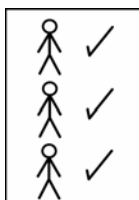
1. Know about Valuing People and Valuing People Now and help other people to understand what they are about.

2. Share the things you know and your experience with the Board

3. Come to all many meetings as you can.

If you know you can't come to a meeting, you must let the Chair know and find someone else who can come in your place.

4. Make sure you are ready for the meeting by reading the papers, talking about them in your group or service and thinking about what you want to say at the meeting.

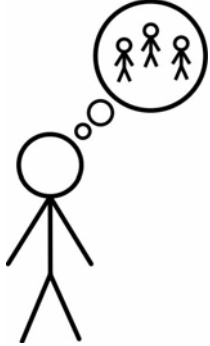




5. Join in at the meetings – speak up, say what you think and ask questions.

6. Be the representative from your group or service at the Board.

This means telling the Board what your group or service is doing about the important things in Valuing People and Valuing People Now.



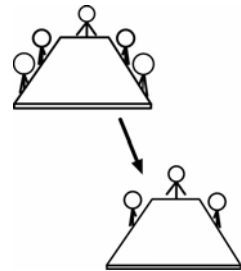
7. Be the representative from the Partnership Board in your group or service.

This means telling your service about the work of the Partnership Board and making sure the things the Board decides are happening in your group or service.

8. Speak up about the lives of people with learning disabilities and their families, and the work of the Partnership Board in other groups and meetings.

9. If you are asked, represent the Partnership Board at other meetings.

10. If you are asked, be part of the working groups of the Partnership Board e.g. the Communication SubGroup.
